Schools that achieve PSQM demonstrate commitment and expertise in science leadership, teaching and learning.

The Primary Science Quality Mark is led by the University of Hertfordshire, Enterprise and Business Development in collaboration with the Primary Science Teaching Trust.

Associate Professor Jane Turner, PSQM National Director said: "There was never a more important time for primary children to have a high-quality science education. The Coronavirus Pandemic has made everyone aware of the impact of science on our daily lives. Primary schools have an important role to ensure that children understand how science



works and keeps us healthy and safe. Schools that have achieved a Primary Science Quality

Mark have demonstrated a significant commitment to science teaching and learning, even at
this challenging time for schools. The profile and quality of science in each awarded school is
very high. Children are engaging with great science both in and outside the classroom,
developing positive attitudes towards science as well as secure scientific understanding and
