Key facts/knowledge


- A decade is ten years.

- Some changes over time may come about because of improvements in technology.
- Going to school has been a law in the UK since 1870.
- The Victorians were the people who lived during the reign of Queen Victoria.

Key vocabulary

- **Historical vocabulary:** past, present, today, tomorrow, future, years ago, timeline, order, before, after
- Chronology: the order in which things happen
- Source: Something that gives us information about the past.
- Evidence: The information historians take from sources.
- Similar: Something that is like something else alike but not identical.
- Different: Something that is not like something else.
- Beyond living memory: Over 100 years ago.
