This year Recycle Week is celebrating its 20th anniversary and the Crawford Village Primary School Eco Council would like you to get involved!

As well as thinking about how you can recycle at home, we will be running a competition during the week. Any child who wishes to enter simply needs to recycle and reuse household items to create a model of an animal. Entries will open on Monday 16th October and the competition will close on Thursday 19th October.

In addition to this, children in the Eco Club will be running environmental themed playground games throughout the week at playtimes.

How can we help you travel greener? Walking and cycling survey

Everyone is invited to take part in a survey to help shape future plans for cycling and walking in Lancashire.

Lancashire County Council, in partnership with Blackpool Council, want to join up the gaps in our existing network of footpaths and cycle routes and provide safer, direct and more convenient routes.



Following feedback from our initial public engagement last year, the councils have produced a draft network map of cycling and walking networks routes in Lancashire. They need people from all areas of the county to provide feedback on anything you think could be improved, including what would help encourage you to walk and cycle to school. The survey will be available on their website until 24 October.

Additional design and feasibility work will be needed to take any of the proposed schemes forward.



European Day of Languages In Pictures









Scientists have revealed rafflesias are in danger of extinction. Rafflesias are a plant species found in jungles across Southeast Asia, including Brunei, Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, and Thailand.



Rafflesias are a special species; not only are they the world's largest flower (spanning 1 metre wide), but they are also the world's smelliest flower, and are known to smell like decaying meat! The rafflesia plant does not have roots, stems, or leaves, and its flower has a rubbery texture. It extracts water from nearby vines.





Rafflesias are at risk of extinction because they depend on vines to stay alive, however, vine numbers are reducing due to deforestation. The rafflesia species is found in areas where forests are being destroyed and Researchers say not enough is being

done to protect this intriguing species. Much remains unknown about rafflesias. The International Union for the Conservation of Nature is calling for greater protection for and understanding of rafflesias.
