Computing

Touch Typing & Making Music

- Begin to use typing terminology.
- Understand the correct way to sit at the keyboard.
- Practise typing with both hands and improve typing for home, top and bottom row keys.

- Describe the human and physical features of one of the UK's capital cities.

English

- Y1 & Y2 – Classic stories; rhymes.
- Y3 – Novel as a theme; non-chronological reports.
- Y1 – Extend range of joining words to link words and clauses using *but* and *or*.
- Y2 – Use apostrophes for contracted forms and singular possession in nouns; use suffix *ly* to turn adjectives into adverbs; select, generate and effectively use adverbs and verbs.
- Y3 – Use inverted commas to punctuate direct speech; understand the Standard English correct verb forms for singular and plural subjects.

- In addition to the daily English lesson, Year 1 and 2 have daily phonics sessions.
- Year 3 follows a focused spelling programme which is based on a two weekly cycle.
- Years 2 & 3 will also have a daily Reading session focusing on vocabulary and comprehension skills.
