## Key vocabulary

- Human features: something that is built by humans and would not have existed in nature e.g. houses, factories, farms, harbours, cities.
- **Physical features:** something that has happened naturally e.g. forests, cliffs, the
- **Bigger:** something big takes up lots of space. Something bigger takes up more space.
- Smaller: something small is little. Something smaller is even littler.
- Near: something near is a short way away. It is the opposite of far.
- Far: something far is a long way away. It is the opposite of near.
- Landmark: something (such as a building, large tree or statue) that is easy to see and can guide people.
- Scale: the size of an object compared with the object's smaller representation on a map.
- Aerial photo: photos taken from above by a camera mounted on an aircraft, balloon, kite or something similar.
