- Empire: a large group of countries ruled over by one ruler.
- Invasion: to enter somewhere as an enemy.
- **Conquer**: take control of by force.

Julius Caesar (100 BC-44 BC)

A famous Roman leader who invaded

Britain twice, in 55BC and in 54BC. He won many battles for Rome and helped the Roman Empire grow. He was only emperor for a year until he was mur



Claudius (10 BC- 54

Claudius led the successful invasion of Britain in 43AD. He



did a lot for the empire, such as building many roads and canals and improving the army.

Boudicca (30 AD-61
