Mammals — Warm-blooded creatures that tend to have hair.

Birds — Warm-blooded animals that tend to have feathers. They lay eggs.

Fish — Cold blooded animals that live in the water. They have fins and scales.

Amphibians — Cold blooded animals that live in the water and on land.

Reptiles — Cold blooded animals that lay eggs. They have scales.

Vet – They are Doctors for animals.

Herbivore — Animals that eat only plants.

Omnivore — Animals that eat meat and plants.

Carnivore – Animals that only eat meat.
