This week has seen us receive our SATs results for our Year 6 pupils. We are incredibly proud of their achievements and the results speak for themselves – they are amazing! 100% of our pupils in Year 6 achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and maths combined, compared to 59% nationally. We also had some fantastic greater depth scores with 50% of our pupils achieving greater depth in maths. Of course, school isn't all about always getting top scores in tests but these children have been true examples of what hard work and tenacity can achieve, especially given the fact that much of their upper KS2 education was disrupted by COVID. They are now enjoying a little bit of extra-curricular fun as they prepare for their final week of primary school.

In other success stories, our Y5/6 team won the inter-school book quiz on Tuesday after successfully answering questions on Harry Potter novels and Gangsta Granny. They were brilliant! Plus, we are also looking forward to the inter-school football match on Monday where our team has got through to the grand final. The match will be at St Thomas the Martyr at 3.30pm so please come along and support if you are able.


We have also been following the adventures of the children at Borwick Hall. They appear to have had a wonderful time – there'll be some very tired children this evening, I think!
























