- Recognise that we need light in order to see things and that dark is the absence of light.
- Notice that light is reflected from surfaces.
- Recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and there are ways to protect our eyes.
- Recognise that shadows are formed when a solid object blocks the light from a light source.
- Find patterns in the way that the size of shadows can change.

Key vocabulary

- Light source: anything that makes light, whether natural or artificial
- Opaque: not able to be seen through
- **Transparent:** allowing light to pass through so that objects behind can be distinctly seen
- Translucent: allowing light, but not detailed shapes, to pass through
- Reflective: provides a reflection
- **Reflection**: the throwing back of light by a surface without absorbing it
